Goldie, a 20-year-old Quarter Horse, is blind in her left eye and has multiple scars on her back legs. She was originally known as *Horse 15*, being one of 19 horses seized by the Polk County Sheriff's Office. They found she had been used as a broodmare for most of her life. She arrived here July 10th from Hope Equine Rescue with Raider (below).



Raider, a 26-year-old Quarter Horse, is a former barrel horse that was retired due to injury. The injury can limit his movement, but he is not lame. His owner of the last 10 years passed away and the owner's wife moved, leaving him on his own. Thankfully, he was brought to the attention of Hope Equine and now has a forever home at Mill Creek Farm.
