Sly - Completely blind due to an untreated eye infection/condition prior to arrival



Echoing Wind - Partial blindness in left eye



Butch - Blind in one eye



Goosebumps - Very limited vision; Appaloosas, the breed and the color pattern, are more prone to blindness due to the Leopard Complex gene and because they are more likely to have white around their eyes which reflects the sun and damages the eye



Shadow - Partial blindness in both eyes



Andy - Developed cancer in his right eye which was removed to prevent it from spreading
